



## **Middleton School Board appoints Beck to lead district, accepts Reberry's resignation**



The Middleton Board of Trustees unanimously accepted the resignation of Superintendent Sherawn Reberry during a special meeting today (Wednesday, June 3).

Reberry's resignation, submitted Tuesday, is effective immediately, however, the board agreed to honor the contract that expires June 30. Reberry had been on personal leave since May 27.



With a 3-2 vote, the Board appointed Kristin Beck to lead the district as Interim Superintendent until the position is filled.

Beck has been the Human Resources and Communications Officer for nearly a year.

Beck has two graduate degrees from the University of Idaho in educational leadership, and holds a superintendent credential. She attended the College of Southern Idaho and Idaho State University for her undergraduate work in elementary education.

Beck was an elementary teacher in the Twin Falls School District for six years before moving into instructional coaching and administration. She worked as a building administrator for one year and was subsequently promoted as the Superintendent and Federal Programs Director for the Hansen School District for five more years before relocating to the Treasure Valley in 2018. Beck has worked for Idaho Digital Learning Alliance as a regional administrator and on-line principal, both full-time and part-time since 2011.

The Board of Trustees did not discuss the outcome of the supplemental levy during the special meeting.

However, the district's leadership team will prepare a budget and most likely hold a budget workshop with the trustees later this month.

Part of that discussion will include the potential budget cuts that had been identified in late April, if the \$1.5 million levy failed as well as the holdbacks for both the current year and fiscal year 2021. Final budget decisions will be reviewed at the annual budget hearing, set for June 29. [Here's information about the district's budget timeline.](#)
